

4 Week Community Life Kenya CP2704

You will be working alongside local Kenyans as part of an ongoing development programme with a coastal primary school and the surrounding village to improve the lives of the local people by enabling the community to become self-sustaining.

Work will involve expanding and enhancing existing facilities as well as building new ones. By spending 18 days assisting in the building and renovation of classrooms and other amenities (e.g. making desks), you not only will learn new skills such as bricklaying, carpentry, plastering, painting, and basket weaving, but will also appreciate what a valuable contribution your time and effort has made to the community. There may also be the opportunity to teach and coach sports.

Additionally, your safari adventures will take you from the lush tropical rainforests of Shimba Hills, a stronghold for the now endangered Angolan black and white colobus monkey and sable antelope, to the semi arid savannah of the Tsavo ecosystem where there is a good chance of spotting the 'big five'. You will also get the unique opportunity to see some of the more elusive nocturnal creatures during a night game drive in Taita Ranch and spend some time relaxing on the beautiful beaches on the South coast of Kenya.

Itinerary (30 nights/ 31 days)

Day 1, Mombasa – Mukurumuji Camp - Arrive at Mombasa Airport and transfer to base situated near the Indian Ocean for meet and greet and a brief orientation of Diani. This will be followed by a short scenic transfer to Mukurumuji camp in the Sable Valley for lunch. After settling in to your tented accommodation, you will be given a full briefing and orientation before dinner. (LD)

Day 2, Mukurumuji Camp – In the morning, after a wildlife safety briefing, we enjoy a guided walk to spot elephants (which roam freely in the area) and visit the local community and school. After dinner you will be given a basic Swahili lesson. (BLD)

Days 3-7, Volunteer Programme – Five rewarding days participating in our school and community development programme at Mukurumuji. (BLD)

Day 8, Ocean day – An opportunity to relax by the beach, do some shopping, or sign up for one of the many optional adventure activities available at Aqualand Adventure Centre. (BLD)

Day 9, Cultural day – You will be shown around a traditional local homestead of the coastal Swahili people by a specialist guide for a 'hands on' cultural experience. This could include basket weaving, roof thatching, and local food harvesting, preparation and cooking techniques.(BLD)

Days 10-14, Volunteer Programme – Continuing your work on our community development programme at Mukurumuji. (BLD)

Days 15-17, Safari, Shimba Hills National Reserve - Mwaluganje Elephant Safari - Shimba Hills National Reserve offers beautiful, lush scenery and has a unique and botanically rich coastal rainforest. It is most famous for its sable

antelope that are found nowhere else in Kenya and is also a haven for the endangered Angolan black and white colobus monkey. Game drives before transferring to Mwaluganje Elephant Sanctuary. The sanctuary boasts the highest density (per km²) of elephants in Africa. Learn about elephant behaviour and the threats facing this amazing animal. Overnight is spent at the Traveller's Camp, situated in the centre of the Sanctuary overlooking a water hole where a variety of wildlife regularly comes to drink. (BLD)

Days 18-22, Volunteer Programme - Continuing your work on our community development programme at Mukurumuji. (BLD)

Day 23, Ocean day – Another day for rest and relaxation. Optional adventure activities available at Aqualand Adventure Centre. (BLD)

Days 24-26, Volunteer Programme - Three final days to continue your valuable contribution to our community development programme at Mukurumuji. (BLD)

Days 27-29, Safari, Satao Rock/Taita Ranch - Tsavo East National Park - Satao Rock Camp is located on the 98,000 acre Taita ranch on the border of Tsavo East National Park. The camp overlooks a small waterhole where there are opportunities to see elephant, cheetah, lion, leopard, impala, warthog, buffalo, lesser kudu, baboons and vervet monkeys. Afternoon and night game drives, which give you the chance to spot more elusive nocturnal creatures. Game drive before breakfast at Taita Ranch. Transfer to Tsavo East National Park for game drives. Tsavo East is one of the largest national parks in Kenya and is also home to some of the largest herds in Kenya. Game includes elephant, rhino, lion, leopard, crocodile, waterbuck, kudu, gerenuk, zebra and Aruba Hunter's Hartebeest. Return to Satao Rock Camp to overnight. Game drive before breakfast then again en route to Buchuma gate to exit the park. Transfer back to Mukurumuji Camp. (BLD)

Day 30, Community Farewell - An opportunity to say goodbye to the people that you have worked closely with over the previous weeks. (BLD)

Day 31, Departure - Transfer to Mombasa and depart. (BL)

Please be aware that the exact nature of the work you will be involved in will depend on the current needs and priorities of the school and village. As volunteers it is important to remain flexible and keep in mind that sometimes priorities and/or emergencies may arise which may result in your duties changing at short notice.

Fitness

None of the activities featured require anything more than a reasonable level of fitness. No special skills are required for any of our projects.
